



Careers in Project Management:

Project management skills are needed across multiple disciplines, from technology to manufacturing, real estate to construction, and sales management to service. The Project Management Institute projects 22 million new jobs in seven project-oriented sectors through 2027.



Project Management can be pursued at the undergrad level as a <u>B.S</u>, or as a <u>certificate</u>, and is also offered at the graduate level as either a <u>Master's degree</u> or a <u>post-bachelor's certificate</u>.

Saint Louis University's Bachelor of Science in Emergency Management is the only undergraduate emergency management program offered at a Jesuit university in the United States. Through SLU's School for Professional Studies, you will learn to administer aid and assistance to others, helping to ensure the resilience of your community in the face of disasters large and small. This comprehensive, multi-disciplinary program focuses on all sectors recognized by the Department of Homeland Security and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), providing students with essential skills for careers in the emergency management sector.


If you choose to major in emergency management, potential careers include emergency manager, risk manager, disaster communications, business continuity, homeland security professional, search and rescue, firefighting, law enforcement, and training and exercise officer. After completing your degree, you will have completed most of the requirements for the International Association of Emergency Managers (IAEM) Certification as an Associate Emergency Manager (AEM). Many employers require this professional certification for posted new positions.





Emergency Management can be pursued at the undergraduate level as either a <u>Bachelor's</u> degree or <u>certificate</u> and is offered at the graduate level as a <u>post-bachelor's certificate</u>.

What is Emergency Management?



In the past few years alone, you've probably heard the term "historic event" more than a handful of times, and that trend shows no sign of reversing. Natural disasters like tornadoes, floods and viral outbreaks plus man-made disasters like terrorist attacks, cyberterrorism, mass shootings, arson or war can have devastating effects on individuals, communities and entire regions.

When people are unprepared for storms and other emergencies, it increases the likelihood of tragic deaths, economic damage and long-term social ramifications. However, with effective emergency management, the negative effects can be reduced or even prevented entirely.


SCHOOL FOR PROFESSIONAL STUDIES
